**MRS. JACOB KLEIN DIES,
LIVED HERE FIFTY YEARS**

**Husband, Omaha Pioneer,
One of Founders of Wise
Memorial Hospital**

ILL ONLY A FEW DAYS

Mrs. Jacob Klein, 97, a resident of Omaha since 1873, died suddenly at the home of her son, Max Klein, 3323 Cass Street yesterday morning following an acute attack of asthma with which she was stricken four days ago.

Jacob Klein, her husband, who died nineteen years ago today, was one of the founders of Wise Memorial hospital, and founded B'nai Jacob temple, according to his children.

Mrs. Klein was born in Austria-Hungary in 1827, and came to American in 1873, arriving in Omaha in the same year with her husband and family. The father built a home at Twenty-seventh and Cuming streets at a time when that part of Omaha was an unbroken prairie. Mr. Klein died nineteen years ago, and since that time Mrs. Klein has been making her home with her children.

She was exceptionally active in the latter years of her life, and up to four days ago aided in the household work and gave several hours daily to a perusal of the newspapers. Her twenty-one great-grandchildren also survive her. The children are: William Klein of Buffalo, N.Y., Mrs. A. M. Lesser of San Francisco, Mrs. S. Hirschberg and Max Klein of Omaha.

The funeral will be held Thursday morning at 10 a.m., from the home with burial in Pleasant Hill Cemetery. Rabbi J. M. Charlop will have charge of the services.
